Mr. Nation discussed the BLM/McCurry (Cherokee Road) pit meeting he attended on July 14, 2006.

AIRPORT DEVELOPMENT GROUP

Jim Sirhall, Airport Development Group (ADG) advised that due to the length of time to finalize the easements, the proposals for the improvements to the Dixon Airport, Project #3-56-0038-08 have expired. The desired contractor, Connell Resources, Inc. has increased their original bid with the County's portion being an additional \$80,000.

Mr. Sirhall presented two options to the Board; 1) to approve an additional \$80,000 for the Dixon Airport Project with a possible reimbursement from the State of Wyoming later in the year 2008, or 2) not approve the additional funds, the State and FAA funds would go to another project, Carbon County has already invested funds in the Dixon Airport and the improvements to the Dixon Airport would not get completed. If approved, the additional \$80,000 would not be disbursed until the end of the project, October or November timeframe.

A discussion followed with Mr. Sirhall, Nick Tessitore, ADG and Jay Linderman, Dixon Airport Board.

County Attorney Dave Clark, advised he reviewed the contract and has no objections to the County paying the additional \$80,000. Commissioner Weickum moved to approve the additional funds in the amount of \$80,000. Chairman Zeiger seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Tessitore presented the Contract Agreement for Improvements to Dixon Airport in the amount of \$1,996,204 and Contract Supplemental Agreement No. One in the amount of \$130,965.90. Commissioner Weickum moved to approve the Contract Agreement for Improvements to Dixon Airport, Project #3-56-0038-08 in the amount of \$1,996,204, and Contract Supplement Agreement No. One in the amount of \$130,965.90 for a total revised contract of 2,127,169.90. Chairman Zeiger seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Tessitore presented a Notice to Proceed and a Notice of Award to Connell Resources, Inc. for Chairman Zeiger's signature.

Mr. Sirhall advised Brian Wright, ADG will be the field engineer on this project.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Commissioner Weickum moved to go into executive session at 3:21p.m with Will Speer, Linda Smith, and Diana Obe. Chairman Zeiger seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Weickum moved to declare executive session over at 5:07 p.m. Chairman Zeiger seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business, Chairman Zeiger adjourned the meeting at 5:36 p.m.
