

COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS

SPECIAL MEETING

The Board of County Commissioners met September 11, 1942, at 10:00 o'clock A. M., all members present John F. Gooldy, Chairman.

Mr. L. E. Armstrong appeared before the Board of Commissioners on behalf of the Town of Parco. Mr. Armstrong stated that they desired a reconsideration of the action taken by the Board of County Commissioners on September 2, 1942, relative to changing the name of the Town of Parco.

The same being considered by the Board, it was regularly moved by Commissioner McCarthy, seconded by Hansen and unanimously carried that the action taken on September 2, 1942, relative to the changing of the name of the Town of Parco, be reconsidered. Thereafter Mr. Armstrong requested that the action taken by the Board on said second day of September, 1942, be amended in the following particulars:

To strike out the word "Sinco" and substitute the word "Sinclair".

After due consideration a motion was made by Hansen, seconded by McCarthy and unanimously carried, that the name "Sinclair" be substituted for the name "Sinco".

Thereafter a motion was made by McCarthy, seconded by Hansen and unanimously carried to adopt and ratify in all particulars the action taken on September 2, 1942, relative to the changing of the name of the Town of Parco as now amended ^{to "Sinclair"} with instructions to the County Clerk to transcribe in full the entire action taken on September 2, 1942, as now amended by the Board of County Commissioners.

A motion was duly made, seconded and unanimously carried whereby David W. Ellis of Medicine Bow was appointed as Justice of the Peace for Justice Precinct No. 4 for the unexpired term.
