

4th Floor Changes

The 4th Floor of the Courthouse was used as the County Jail until 2005 when the new Jail and Communications Center opened. The 4th floor has sat mostly untouched since 2005 and has been used for storage by various offices/departments. To create a Courthouse with all judicial functions under one roof, the County Attorney will move out of the Carbon Building and into the Courthouse. This "prime real estate" was perfect for the County Attorney to move into and be near the Courts and the people they serve regularly.

The public will access this floor using the updated elevator only. In case of emergency, there are internal fire stairs. Operational policies will be established on staff use of the north stair.

County Attorney staff will have access to a private restroom. No other restrooms will be provided on this floor. The closest public restroom is located on the 3rd floor.



COURTHOUSE - 2nd FLOOR



County Attorney (Blue on the Plan Above)

The County Attorney relocation/remodel will provide:

- A Conference Room with adjacent beverage counter.
- Two Interview Rooms for attorneys to meet with clients outside of their private offices.
 - One (1) Interview Room can be accessed directly from the Public Reception/Waiting area.
 - The other Interview Room is considered a "Soft" Interview Room and could be used to meet with vulnerable clients.
- Seven (7) private Attorney Offices, including the County Attorney, and one (1) Investigator Office for future growth.
- Private staff restroom.
- Records storage area with a movable system.
- Private Office Manager Office located near the Legal Assistants and front reception counter.
- Space for six (6) Legal Assistants with easy access to the front reception counter.
- Secure reception counter to greet and screen clients prior to entering the office suite.
- Large work area.
- Secure NCIC Room.

Interim Justice Center (812 Murray Street) Update



← Public (South) Entry into the Interim Justice Center. Entry screening will be just beyond this entry vestibule. Metal detectors will be provided at the facility once the Courts have moved.

Public Lobby facing east towards the District Courtroom/Public Health area. Windows and doors on the north represent the County Attorney's Office, Clerk of District Court/Public Health and the Sheriff's Office Victim/Witness areas.
